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I totally agree with the 'Human education' Initiative in all points.

On top of that, I would like to suggest a number of points for consideration:

- The importance of civil society and political parties and their influences in education policy.
- Do the African governments really have political will to change the education? Do they really feel a need for critical thinking in education and critical thinking democratic societies?
- We have to start from primary school to create and develop the child personality.
- The curriculum is not enough to achieve our aims without school activities (arts, sports, school trips to historical sites and places of political institutions such as parliament, courts, etc.).
- The role of democratic procedures in school life, such as the practice of electing and nominating candidates through the school union.
- Civil society should take responsibility for education and collaborate with schools so that students can put human education into practice both in and out of schools.
- Civil society should take a part in education policy.
